COMMUNITY HEALTH CENTER

Health centers are community-based, patient-directed clinics that treat medical, dental, mental health, substance use, and other health care needs. Many of them offer care in multiple languages, can help with transportation, and have on-site pharmacies that provide discounted prescription drugs.

Health centers provide care to people and groups who find it difficult to access health care, including tribal communities, people in rural and frontier communities, people without homes,

migrant farm workers, people who live in public housing, and veterans. About 90% of health center patients have incomes less than 200% of the federal poverty level.

Health centers accept all forms of insurance including Medicaid, Medicare, and private insurance. For those without insurance, they offer services on a sliding fee scale based on household income.

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HEALTH CENTER PROGRAM FUNDAMENTALS

- Have a governing board where a majority of its members are patients
- Focus on the needs of the groups of people and the areas they serve
- Develop systems of care that center on the patient
- Offer sliding fee discounts for uninsured patients, based on household income
- Provide medical, dental, and behavioral health care
- Meet stringent administrative, clinical, and financial requirements

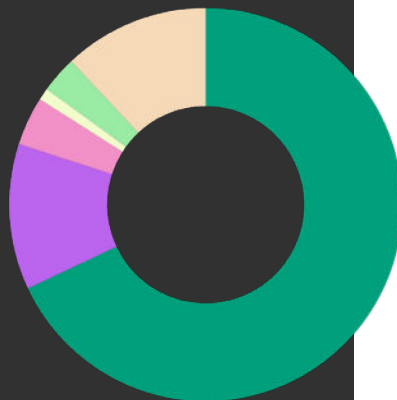

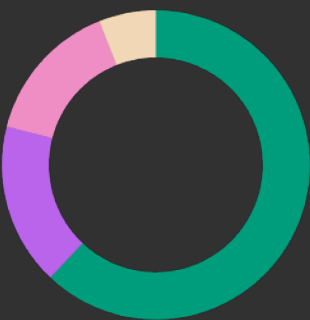

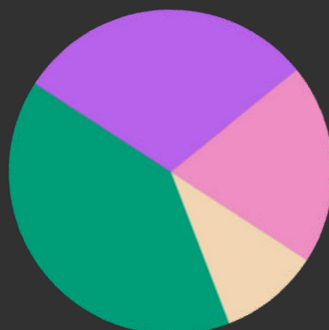
TOTAL HEALTH CENTER REVENUE
